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

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
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

Spokane Valley City Council - August 29, 2023

opened with a motion consideration to establish the City's participation in the Spokane Regional Opioid Abatement Council (OAC). In 2022, the State announced successful settlement with several opioid distributors to apply to abatement of opioid caused privations. The settlement is for approximately \$518 million. Approximately half of that amount was set aside for local governments. Under that agreement, the City is scheduled to receive \$147,000 (Settlement I) over 17 years. That will, of course, be minus deductions for attorneys' fees and settlement expenses. The actual amount the City will receive each year is estimated to be \$5,000-\$7,000.

A second settlement (Settlement II) will result in an additional \$217 million to local governments for 'abatement of opioid related problems'. Approximately the same annual amount as Settlement I is expected. In order to participate, separate forms must be submitted for each settling company by April 31st.

Because of the small amounts each city will receive, discussions have taken place to pool the funds for regional substance abuse use. Administration of that fund requires formation of a 'Regional Opioid Abatement Council' (OAC) to oversee monitoring, reporting, and dispute resolution. Spokane County will take the lead in establishing the OAC. Approval of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes the City's participation. The motion to approve the MOU passed unanimously.

The Barker Road/BNSF Rail Crossing project was awarded to the Max J. Kuney Company (Kuney) for construction on January 28, 2021, by the Washington trict Superintendent, updating the disturbing events State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), the project manager.

Although the project is largely completed, change orders still remain. The City and WSDOT coordinate on all change orders for the project with Kuney regardless of the amount. The total of those change orders number 67 with a cumulative total of \$13,627,059.66 for the entire project which is 17.1% over the original contract of \$11,637,134.

The Contractor's successful low bid was \$2,000,000 below the next lowest bidder. That bid must be accepted under the rules for selecting the successful bidder. However, a low bid can often be enhanced by

This meeting of the Spokane Valley City Council the change order process and the project cannot move forward without approval of the change orders. The motion to approve change orders numbers 29, 41, and 68 totaling \$137,846.53 was approved unanimously.

> As part of the City's annual budget process, each department establishes goals for Council to consider for the upcoming year. The following goals were presented for Council consideration and were agreed upon. This discussion is one of the eight times Council will discuss various sections of the 2024 Budget enroute to final adoption on November 21st.

- 1. Public Safety: Council's highest priority is providing superior police services.
- 2. Pavement Preservation: Maintain and sustain a safe and resilient transportation infrastructure using cost effective means and methods.
- 3. Transportation and Infrastructure: Strengthen and improve transportation infrastructure to safely connect the community while supporting a diverse and robust economy.
- 4. Economic Development: Actively support existing businesses and industries using retention and expansion strategies to facilitate employment growth.
- 5. Communications: Increase community interactions, share information, and obtain feedback in providing awareness that makes the City a great place to live, work, and play.

The motion to include those goals in the 2024 Budget passed unanimously.

The action portion of the agenda was followed by a presentation by Brian Talbott, East Valley School Disof the past two months where student suicides, and other incidents have drawn attention to the emotional condition of students in the district.

After Superintendent Talbott's report, Council heard an administrative report from Virginia Clough, City Coordinator, and Justin Johnson, Director of Spokane County Community Services Department and Regional Behavioral Health. The presentation was an overview of behavioral health programs and priorities and initiatives and efforts currently being implemented by the County in the region.

One of the pilot programs currently underway in the

County School Districts is the Initiative for Student Wellness, Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment Program. The program was developed to address the need for children/youth behavioral health services in Spokane County. Over the past week there was discussion about the possibility of expanding this program to the East Valley School District. The County Commissioners unanimously expressed interest in exploring a potential partnership with the City of Spokane Vallely and East Valley School District. Mr. Johnson spoke about what a partnership could look like if there is interest from Council, prompting discussions with Spokane County on combining ARPA funds to achieve maximum effect in addressing mental health

City Finance Director, Chelsie Taylor, presented the 2024 Budget Estimated Revenue and Expense forecast. This is the second of eight occasions where Council will discuss items in that budget. State law requires that the City hold a public hearing on revenue sources and expenditures to consider public input. That hearing is scheduled to take place on September 12th at the regular Council meeting.

The 2024 recurring revenue estimate is \$62,366,100 which is 10.54% greater than 2023 budget. The recurring expenditure estimate of \$57,507,948 is 7.76% more than the 2023 budget of \$53,368,284. Estimated budgeted recurring revenues currently exceed recurring expenditures by \$4,858,152 or 7.79% of recurring revenues. The full-time employee count will rise to 116.25, an increase of four employees. Three of those employees will be utilized in administering the Stormwater commitments authorized by Council earlier this year. The fourth will assume additional duties in the accounting department and our recording fee administration program responsibilities.

City Council meetings are held in the Great Room at CenterPlace until further notice. City Hall, however, is open for business during normal business hours. The Public is invited to Council meetings to participate in action items in Spokane County as well as a list of the programs or public comment periods in person or via ZOOM. 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Fishing Magician

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I fished far and wide this past week, and spent most of my time finishing my sockeye fishing season on Lake Wenatchee. It was an epic season for me on the lake. I also fished the Missouri River near Great Falls, Montana.

When Buell Hawkins added Smoker Craft boats to the Valley Tractor dealership many years ago, he offered me a new boat every year to help him promote this new feature. He made good on his promise and for six years I drove a variety of Smoker Crafts. Bob Feil made an offer to take his inventory to add the boats to their dealership and Hawkins accepted. I promised Buell that I would take him fishing any time he wanted, and I once again made good on my promise taking Buell and his two grandsons fishing on Lake Wenatchee last week. I hadn't fished with Luke Hawkins, Brad Hawkins son, since we got his first king salmon in Bridgeport when he was much younger. I fished with Landon Hawkin, Brian Hawkins son, on a kokanee fishing trip two years ago. It was great having both grandsons and Buell on board. Both boys got to land fish and we had terrific fun fishing together. Buell and I are now planning a trip to Omak Lake. We have fished this lake a couple times in the past and he loves the scenery and the size of the Lahontan cutthroat in this Colville Reservation lake.

The weather forecast was for smoke and wind at Lake Wenatchee last week, but I wanted to take Tom Verschuren on another sockeye fishing trip, so off we went. Turned out the smoke wasn't an issue, but the wind did blow. I had been away from my boat for several days and found a dead battery and couldn't start my big motor, plus didn't have electronics, and couldn't use my downriggers. Hey, I still had a bow mount electric motor so off we went. The bite started a little later than usual, but it did get going and we enjoyed excellent action. Tom mentioned that we were getting bigger than usual sockeye, and that may be as the females are getting fatter with eggs.

My trolling path was taking us further and further down lake, and I was concerned that my bow mount batteries would run down, and we wouldn't make it back to the dock. A few years ago, when fishing for kokanee on Lake Chel-

an, my battery got so low that I couldn't start my big motor or my kicker. We made it to a dock on the bow mount at 1mph. There was someone there working on his lake place, and he hauled the battery out of his electric boat lift down to the boat. I was able to get my kicker started and we made it home. I didn't want a repeat of this experience. This time Tom just started the kicker with a couple of pulls and we were golden. We managed to get our limits of sockeye while on the electric.

The Lake Wenatchee sockeye season closes at the end of August. There were only ten or twelve boats on the water the last time I fished the lake. There were a couple of reasons for the drop in angler participation. One was the smoky conditions and the other was the "iffy" shape of the fish. They were getting closer to their spawning time and some of the fish were pretty washed out, and not even of a quality for smoking.

On a recent trip to Great Falls, Montana my brother in law Tom Verschueren and I spent some time fishing the Missouri River. On our way there we viewed the Clark Fork several times as I-90 passed over the river. I have always wanted to fish the Clark Fork but have never taken the time to stop and try my luck.

When we turned onto Highway 200, and this took us along the Blackfoot River. Smaller than the Clark Fork, it is a very attractive stream. We got many

glimpses of the stream, and it was very wadable and had lots of nice riffles and some deep pools. We both were impressed with the number of public fishing accessed we passed on our way to Great Falls.


We were going to be freelancing, by that I mean fishing from shore on the Missouri River and would have to just find a likely looking spot. Not knowing anything about the hatches or even if we could wade this big river, Tom and I took the same gear we use when fishing from shore on Lake Roosevelt and Ru-

fus Woods.

We turned off Highway 15 southwest of Great Falls, and downriver from the town of Cascade. This highway parallels the river and when we saw a sign for the Canyon Recreation area, we turned off and started looking for a place to fish from the shore. The Missouri is a big river, but we found a likely looking bend, and grabbed our rods and tried our luck off the rip rap bank. On my second cast, my rod made the telltale bounce and a fish jumped in the middle of the river. I managed to land the fish, which was a nice 15-inch rainbow, and I got another 12-inch rainbow. This week's photo is of me with the smaller rainbow I

Although the spot we chose was producing fish we were dragging in a huge amount of weeds. It was a pain having to strip this stuff off of our lines every time we cast. There weren't any weeds where we were placing our casts, but we couldn't retrieve our lines, even with a fish on the end, without getting all weeded up. We thought we could find another place to fish, but didn't come across one, and we drove all the way down to Holter Lake, that was formed by a dam on the Missouri. We also drove through the town of Craig, which is obviously a hub for fishing the river. There were fly shops there and drift boats everywhere. We passed a lot of drift boats on the Missouri on our drive to Holter Lake, and several very nice fishing accesses where the boats could be launched.

Now it's time to get back to fishing this region. Oh, boy! Fall can be the best season of the year.

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
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
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
HOW TO: Secure Your Load for Safer Roads

STOCK UP

Keep cargo nets, tarps, ropes, bungee cords, or straps in your truck to make sure you always have what you need to secure your cargo. You may need tie down hooks or eye bolts on your vehicle as well.



STRAP DOWN

Securely fasten all large items directly to your vehicle, including tarps and covers.



SEAL TIGHT AND COVER

Make sure boxes, bags, and garbage cans are tightly closed and strapped down or covered to keep contents from blowing away.



GET ORGANIZED

Lay tall items flat and put lighter cargo at the bottom of the load so heavier objects can hold them down.



FOLLOW THROUGH



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Taking control of **YOUR WILDFIRE**

What Is the Fire Problem?

Every year, devastating wildfires burn across the United States. At the same time, a growing number of people are living where wildfires are a real risk. While these fires will continue to happen, there are things you can do to protect your home and neighborhood as well as your family's safety. NFPA® has found that in many cases of home destruction during wildfires, the homes were more flammable that the surrounding brush and trees. By taking action now, before a fire starts, you can increase your chances of having a ignition resistant home and community.

What Can Be Done About It?

Research shows that embers (burning pieces of airborne wood and/or vegetation that can be carried more mile through the wind) and small surface fires are the primary source of home ignitions during wildfires. To make your home safer, you need to prepare it to withstand embers and flames or surface fire from touching the home or any attachments. You can do this by limiting the amount of flammable vegetation, choosing ignition-resistant building materials and construction techniques, and conducting periodic outdoor maintenance within the three home ignition zones (HIZ).

WORKING WITH NEIGHBORS

Home ignition zones often overlap onto adjacent properties. This makes the conditions of neighboring homes and vegetation a part of the wildfire threat. It's extremely important that neighbors work collaboratively with each other and talk with each other—to reduce their shared risk.

FIREWISE USA® PROGRAM

Firewise USA® is a voluntary program that provides a framework to help neighbors get organized, find direction, and take action to increase the ignition resistance of their homes and community.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

Organize it: Create a board or committee of volunteers to represent your community. They will work with partners such as local forestry agencies or the fire department to complete a wildfire risk assessment and present it to the community.

Plan it: The wildfire risk assessment should highlight recommendations for action. From this risk assessment, the board will identify and prioritize action items for reducing ignition risk to homes. This action plan may span several years.

Do it: Host an outreach event and work with neighbors on addressing items in the action plan.

Tell us about it: New and renewal applications can be completed at portal firewise.org. Tell us about the actions and efforts in your community to engage residents and complete mitigation work at the home level.

When you look around Spokane, what you see are single-family homes on large lots, along with large multifamily projects. There is virtually nothing in between."

Missing middle housing types like duplexes, triplexes and townhouses make up only 9% of Spokane's housing while single-family detached homes account for over 68%.

Sadly, several neighborhood councils and currently elected City Council members are not eager to help change zoning.

A co-chair of the neighborhood council in Spokane's Comstock neighborhood was recently quoted saying "I have nothing against duplexes and triplexes, just not next to my house.

That is in stark contrast to the prioritized agenda set forth by Spokane Mayor Nadine Woodward in an effort to help bring relief to the housing emergency.

"We need more housing and greater variety now," Woodward said. "Business as usual isn't currently equipped to deliver new construction quickly enough to immediately increase inventory. Efforts to modernize zoning codes and policies are underway

but can't happen soon enough.

MANUFACTURED HOMES



Manufactured homes have been around for many years but sometimes receive an undeserved negative reputation. Since they came to the property with wheels attached, they were initially labeled mobile homes. There have been some famous redneck jokes that highlight this feature. Even though such jokes may be entertaining to most of us, such teasing may unfairly characterize owners of such properties.

While it is a true that stick framed homes generally hold their value better than a manufactured home, many manufactured homes are extremely high quality and offer wonderful floor plans with top-of-the-line amenities. Since a manufactured home offers relatively quick setup, this type of product has been a viable choice that has allowed many folks the enjoyment of a rural location.

Since manufactured homes do not fit under the International Building Code (previously Uniform Building Code), the Washington State Department of Labor and Industries (L&I) has been tasked with the initial factory inspection and given the stewardship for policing and permitting any subsequent alterations or addi-

I once viewed a property which had a quality manufactured home in a wonderful setting. The massive rear deck and impressive covered front deck immediately attracted my attention. I asked if an L&I permit had been obtained when this construction project had been done and the owner assured me that it was built by a licensed contractor, "so it must have had the proper permitting." In this case the contractor had applied for the proper county permits, yet had failed to obtain a permit and inspection from the Department of Labor and Industries. This example highlights the fact that most home owners and many good contractors are simply unaware of this requirement!

Most of the time when a purchaser considers buying a property, one deciding factor is to consider what favorable resale ability the property will have when they decide to move on. When purchasing a manufactured home, a buyer should understand that any alterations done prior to or during their ownership, could have legal ramifications for them, unless such L&I inspections have been completed. Since most people do not find out about this requirement until the 11th hour during a sales transaction, the corrective action required can be irritating and costly, especially if major deficiencies are discovered.

If you own a manufactured home or are planning to do so in the near future, remember this tidbit of information so you can have peace of mind, knowing that your remodel contractor has complied with local and state permitting requirements.

SHOP AROUND FOR THE RIGHT COMPANY


- Get at least 3 written estimates.
- Ask for and check references. If possible, look at jobs the contractor recently completed.
- Check with your local chamber of commerce or Better Business Bureau for complaints.
- Be sure that the contractor has the necessary licenses and insurance, as well as the ability to obtain permits.
- · Ask if the contractor's workers will do the entire job or whether subcontractors will be involved.

READ THE CONTRACT CAREFULLY

- Be sure the contract states exactly what is to be done and how change orders will be handled.
- Check that the contract states when the work will be completed and what recourse you have if it isn't.
- Make sure the contract indemnifies you if work does not meet building codes or regulations.
- Be sure that the contract specifies who will clean up after the job and be responsible for any damage.
- Ensure that the materials meet your specifications.

SEAL THE DEAL

- Remember that you can often cancel a contract within 3 business days of signing it.
- Make a small down payment so you won't lose much if the contractor fails to complete the iob.
- Don't make the final payment until you're satisfied with the work.

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
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

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PLANTING & DIVIDING

Plant spring-flowering bulbs. The rule of thumb is to plant bulbs 2.5 times deeper than they are wide. You can plant and transplant trees and shrubs as well as dig & divide perennial herbs and flowers.

GARDEN MAINTENANCE



To protect tender plants from the damage of early frost and extend the harvest for veggies, cover beds with burlap, boxes, blankets or even newspaper! Prune shrubs and vines to allow airflow in the winter.

LAWN & GRASS



The first 2 weeks are an excellent time to put in a new lawn. Cool weather with rainfall is ideal for grass seeds to germinate and become established. This is also a good time to core aerate existing lawns.

FIREWOOD PREP



Green firewood can harbor beetles that pose threats to garden trees. Eliminate beetles by piling wood into stacks no larger than 4x4x4. Cover with clear plastic or bury the edges and tape the seams.



REPUBLIC, WA. — Students in Republic and Tonasket, like many other schools, have the opportunity to be immersed in the many disciplines of STEM — the acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Math-



One of the key focus points centers on the art of problem solving, critical thinking, creativity, leadership, curiosity and decision making. "Regardless of an eventual career path, these skills prepare young people to be innovators," Pestka said.

"Adversity is inevitable, so we coach how to cope and overcome any situation," Pestka said. "We also aim to allow children to explore and experience during all of our projects."
