





Spokane Valley City Council - October 31, 2023

This Study Session Format meeting of the Spokane Valley City Council opened with a proclamation honoring National American Indian Heritage Month. The meeting started at 4:00 pm to give Council members an opportunity to celebrate Halloween with their families.

The first action item was supposed to be a motion consideration to adopt a Homeless Action Plan (Plan), however, Councilmember Padden felt she hadn't enough time to consider it thoroughly, so action was deferred.

The Plan is a high-level plan that provides a roadmap to address, reduce, and prevent homelessness in the City. Leading up to this action, Council has committed to operate its own homeless housing program and to meet all applicable legal and regulatory requirements set forth under state law.

The plan has three primary objectives:

- 1. To prevent homelessness from occurring in the first place whenever possible
- 2. To reduce existing levels of homelessness
- 3. To improve the quality of life for all Spokane Valley residents

The Plan provides possible strategies for Council to achieve these objectives as funding becomes available. It also provides information on funding sources and crisis/response systems. In committing to its own homeless plan, Council will need to set up a five-year plan before the end of 2024. The motion to defer the Homeless Action Plan passed unanimously.

Last week Council adopted Ordinance 23-018 which creates a new chapter, 3.85 of the Spokane Valley Municipal Code, forming a Transportation Benefit District (TBD). That new chapter provides the following:

- a. Establishes a TBD with the same boundaries as the
- b. The TBD governing board would be City Council. c. Grants to the City all authority allowed under state
- law (RCW 36.73)
- i. May establish fees, taxes, and other revenue sources.

- ii. May authorize annual vehicle fees.
- iii. May submit fees, taxes, and other revenue sources to voters.
- d. Identifies allowable uses for TBD funds.
 - i. Transportation improvements that construct, preserve, maintain, and operate the existing and future transportation infrastructure of the
- e. Identifies when the TBD is dissolved.

The newly created TBD is a separate legal entity. The law allows the City to assume the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the TBD. However, in order to do so, Council must:

- 1. Adopt a resolution declaring its intention to consider assumption of the powers of the TBD and to set a public hearing.
- 2. Conduct a public hearing on the assumption of powers of the TBD.
- 3. Adopt an ordinance assuming the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the TBD.

Proposed Resolution 12-012 declares Council's intention to consider assumption of powers of the Spokane public hearing. The motion to adopt Resolution 23-012 passed 6-1 (Padden, no), setting the date for the public hearing as November 14, 2023. On September 20th, 2022, Council adopted Ordinance 22-016 establishing the Spokane Valley Tourism Promotion Area (TPA). Under the terms of the TPA, the Spokane Valley Hotel Commission (Commission) was formed. The Commission, with Council approval, hired 116 & West as consultants to develop a five-year destination marketing plan starting with an 18-month marketing service plan.

ment of: a brand and identity package to include a total campaign, asset library, virtual visitor center, concepts, and a website. Also planned are social media properties, reputation management, local brand

launch campaign, Spokane Sports support, paid media campaigns, earned media, and strategic account management.

"Discover THE VALLEY and Spokane Valley, WA" (tagline) for branding the City's tourism initiatives were adopted. Progress checkpoints are outlined to monitor the progress and success of the program. For a complete presentation of the plan(s), please visit the City website: www.spokanevalleywa.gov.

On December 13th, 2022, the City agreed to join Spokane County in a Master Plan to improve the Plante's Ferry Sports Complex. The County has dedicated \$5 million of its American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds to the project. The cost of a consultant to construct a master plan is estimated to be \$100,000. An interlocal agreement defining the City's participation in sharing funding for the project, at an approximate cost of \$50,000, was agreed upon.

In February of this year, the consultant, after a detailed site visit, arrived at a phased plan for development. When completed, the Complex will include 13 rectangle fields (soccer, lacrosse, and field hockey), five triangle fields (softball and baseball), expanded Valley TBD which triggers the need for the required parking, and amenities such as restrooms and concessions. NATIVE PLANTS TAKE ROOT ALONG HANGMAN CREEK

Hangman Creek sees largest riparian restoration effort in Spokane County's history

Thousands of willow whips and hundreds of potted stock were recently planted along Hangman Creek, amounting to the single largest riparian restoration effort in Spokane County's history. The project was the first of its kind in Eastern Washington and will transform 169 acres of land previously used for crops into habitat for wildlife and will help improve water quality.

"The project was an enormous success," said Mitch Redfern, environmental specialist for Ecology. "It reinforces the fact that healthy farms and healthy riparian areas can coexist."

The Hangman Creek Riparian Restoration and Conservation Program was funded by us through the Washington State Centennial funds. The Spokane Conservation District received a pass-through grant of just over \$3 million for this project.

With the innovative grant program, landowners agree to 15-year lease contracts and are paid \$300 per acre for land along fish-bearing streams that is taken out of production and put into riparian buffers. It also covers 100% of the installation, materials, and long-term planting maintenance

"The pilot program helped eliminate barriers that many producers have pointed to in the past, including weed control, long-term contracts, economically viable rental rates, and maintenance funding," said Brook Beeler, Ecology's Eastern Region director. "We heard those concerns, worked creatively and cooperatively on solutions and are encouraged

by its success."

All totaled, nine landowners agreed to participate in the program and 45,508 linear feet of bank along Hangman Creek will be restored. Prior to this program, less than 20 acres of riparian restoration had been implemented on dryland crop ground in the Hangman watershed over the last several decades.

Next up, the Spokane Conservation District will continue the implementation and maintenance of the riparian program over the next five years. It will take 10-15 years of growth to provide many of the functional benefits for the watershed.

Once established, this new habitat will provide crucial benefits to fish and wildlife. It will also help to stabilize the shorelines from excessive erosion and prevent runoff from reaching the water. As the trees and shrubs continue to grow, they will shade the water and help regulate the temperature in the watershed in the hot summer months.

"Now that an effective framework for riparian restoration has been established in Hangman Creek, we're eager to see it come to life and continue to grow," said Redfern. "With additional funding on the way and landowners that are interested in participating, we're sure to see transformative change in this watershed."

Why Hangman Creek?

Hangman Creek is a major tributary of the Spokane River that originates in the mountains of Idaho and flows northwest toward its confluence with the Spokane River. Hangman Creek and its tributaries are listed among the state's polluted waters.

Riparian areas are important to Hangman Creek because they shade the water, keeping it cool, and provide woody debris, food, and shelter for fish and wildlife. Planting trees and shrubs in riparian areas reduces stream temperatures, stabilizes stream banks, and helps reduce runoff pollution.



Fishing Magician

I think I picked the worst day to fish last week. We have had some really nice sunny days this fall, and I should pay more attention to the weather and less about when I want to go. If I am more patient and pick sunny and calm days I will probably have better experiences on the water.

My fishing partner James Lebow asked for the second time, "Whose idea was this"? Well, it was my idea. James is one of my frequent fishing partners that I can count on to go rain or shine. I thought I had picked a day with part-

ly sunny skies and calm water. However, we were in the fourth hour of walleye fishing on Potholes Reservoir, and I was wrong about the weather. The wind was knocking us around, our fingers were freezing, and James was having a heck of a time keeping the boat straight.

We were looking for walleye in the rolling dunes northeast of the State Park. Occasionally, we would see a walleye mark on the screen, but the bite was far from hot. We had landed some decent walleye but the intervals between good bites and landing a fish were long. We had caught some dandy largemouth bass, a whopper bluegill, and a decent perch. We stuck with it though. I was glad I wasn't driving. James had the kicker in gear and used the bow mount to steer us through the

marks on the fish finder he laid down on previous trips. Actually, we were glad we put up with the conditions as long as we did. When we headed for the dock there were five nice walleye in the live well. They ranged in size from 14 to 20 inches. More than enough for a couple of fresh walleye dinners. It wasn't the coldest day we had spent on Potholes, but it was close. This week's photo is of the 20 incher from our trip to Potholes.

As you probably know, I have been checking on the Icicle River for signs of coho salmon for the past few weeks. Finally, I found evidence of them being in the river. In fact, I came across two anglers with their limits of coho. They were fishing at the hole right at the boundary below the hatchery. They had their four fish and showed me photos of

several more that were in the hole. They said they had several more swats on their twitching jigs and finally hooked and landed their four.

If they are there they are in other areas of the Icicle. They said another place they had heard that fish were being taken was at the access off Icicle River Road. Although the fish are dark in appearance, in previous seasons, I have found that the meat is still dark red on these fish. It sure took the fish a long time to show up this year, due to the very low water conditions.



We are expecting rain for the next several days and that should move more coho into the upper Icicle. I am glad to see they are finally getting here. Now's the time to get 'em. There were more anglers than I had seen on the Icicle last weekend. Fishing is still pretty slow, though. One angler I talked to had released a fish that was foul hooked, but that was it for him. He was the only angler I saw in the stretch near the handicapped platform. There were more anglers fishing the corner below the boat launch that I didn't talk to.

I got a call from Kevin Witte the other day. I have done a couple of videos with Kevin, who guides for walleye, kokanee and sturgeon, out of Kettle Falls. In one I landed a walleye that probably weighed over 14 pounds, and in the other one I landed a sturgeon just under the

slot limit. He said sturgeon fishing on Lake Roosevelt is hot right now. He is averaging 10 to 12 fish a day. The slot limit is 53 to 63 inches, and he is getting his share of keepers. The day I talked to him his party hooked 20, landed 16 and got one keeper. He is fishing two areas right now. One is off the mouth of the Colville River and the other is around China Bend. He says he hits several holes on his way up to China Bend and that makes it a fun trip. Kevin mentioned that he is very impressed with

the hatchery program, and the way the sturgeon fishery on Lake Roosevelt is going. He will be fishing right up to the end of the season on November 30th. I couldn't make it up to fish with Kevin next week, but there are more open days in November. Man, I do want to do a day of this. If you want to experience "big game" fishing in Washington, you can contact Kevin at 509-398-7995, or visit his website at www.UpriverOut-fitter.com.

If you fish Brants Landing or the fishing accesses above Chief Joseph Dam on Rufus Woods, you have probably met Dave, the guy that checks catches of trout for the Colville Tribe. He is out their almost every day and is a great source of current information on the fishing. I called him the other day, wondering if it was time to give fishing a try

from the shore at Brandts Landing. After talking with Dave, I decided I might want to wait a few weeks. He reported that fishing had been pretty slow, and the fish that angles were catching had been smaller than usual. There are some 1- to 2 pound trout caught, and he doesn't know where they are coming from. The triploids that the Colville Tribe releases into Rufus Woods are typically bigger than this when they go in and are much larger than that by the fall and winter.

I usually start fishing at Brandts in December, and I think I will stick to that plan this year. I would probably have better luck fishing from shore at Spring Canyon or Keller for trout on Lake Roosevelt. If I hit it on the right day I have caught a limit of them that measure 16 to 21 inches. These are triploids, too, and are great for smoking.

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
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


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
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
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BULBS



As long as the ground has not frozen, you can plant spring bulbs directly into the garden. Follow instructions on bulb packaging for depth of planting & provide a mulch cover over the top of newly planted bulbs to prevent heaving.


HOUSEPLANTS
