Tasty Tidbits About Eggnog

Eggnog is a rich and delicious beverage that has become synonymous with the most festive time of year. This milk- and egg-based concoction is tasty on its own, or it can be dressed up with other flavors and spiked with a favorite spirit when celebrating the holiday season with other adult partygoers.

December is National Eggnog Month, and December 24 is National Eggnog Day. There is no more perfect time of year to learn everything you can about eggnog — all the while sipping a cup of this creamy concoction. 
- Eggnog likely originated in the medieval period and was known as "posset," a hot, milk-based drink made of spices and wine. Even though posset could be a cocktail, it also was used as a remedy for colds and flu for its soothing properties.
- Milk, eggs and sherry used in the early recipes were difficult to come by, so when eggnog first appeared it was a drink only the wealthy could enjoy. That changed when eggnog was popularized in the American colonies, where dairy products and liquor were more readily available.
- Entymologists believe "eggnog" stems from the word "noggin," which refers to small wooden mugs often used to serve strong ale, known by the slang word "nog."
- In the Medieval period, it was risky to drink milk straight because it wasn't pasteurized. Eggnog contained alcohol so that it would kill off any harmful bacteria in the milk.

- A typical home-made version of eggnog has roughly one egg per serving. However, commercial eggnog is regulated by the FDA and can only contain 1 percent of the product's final weight in egg yolk solids. That stems from fear of raw egg and salmonella.
- President George Washington apparently enjoyed serving eggnog at



- There is no right or wrong alcohol to use when preparing eggnog. Distilled spirits like rum, sherry, cognac, and whiskey all have produced suitable eggnogs.
- Puerto Rican coquito is a traditional drink that is very similar to eggnog.
- Individuals concerned about eggs or milk in eggnog can enjoy a vegan recipe made from nut milk instead. Commercially produced vegan eggnog offerings are now more widely available.
- One of the more notable flavors in eggnog comes from the use of nutmeg. Nutmeg is a fragrant spice made from grinding the seed of the nutmeg tree.



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

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
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How to Spot, **Avoid & Report FAKE CHECK SCAMS**

Fake checks might look like business or personal checks, cashier's checks, money orders, or a check delivered electronically. Here's what to know about fake check scams.

In a fake check scam, a person you don't know asks you to deposit a check. It's usually for more than they owe you, and it's sometimes for several thousand dollars. They tell you to send some of the money back to them or to another person. They always have a good story to explain why you can't keep all the money. They might say they need you to cover taxes or fees for a prize, to buy supplies for a job, to send back money they overpaid, or something else. But this is a scam.

Why Do These Scams Work?

These scams work because fake checks generally look just like real checks, even to bank employees. They are often printed with the names and addresses of legitimate financial institutions. They may even be real checks written on bank accounts that belong to someone whose identity has been stolen. It can take weeks for a bank to figure out that the check is a fake.

Fake Checks and Your Bank

By law, banks have to make deposited funds available quickly, usually within two days. When the funds are made available in your account, the bank may say the check has "cleared," but that doesn't mean it's a good check. Fake checks can take weeks to be discovered and untangled. By that time, the scammer has any money you sent, and you're stuck paying the money back to the bank.

Your best bet: Don't rely on money from a check unless you know and trust the person you're dealing with.

How To Avoid a Fake Check Scam

Never use money from a check to send gift cards, money orders, cryptocurrency, or to wire money to anyone who asks you to. Many scammers demand that you buy gift cards and send them the PIN numbers, buy cryptocurrency and transfer it to them, or send money through wire transfer services like Western Union or Money Gram. Once you do, it's like you've given them cash. It's almost impossible to get it back.

Toss offers that ask you to pay for a prize. If it's free, you shouldn't have to pay to get it. Only scammers will ask you to pay to collect a "free" prize. Don't accept a check for more than the selling price. You can bet it's a scam.

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

Recent Updates...

Spokane Valley City Council - December 12, 2023

As previously mentioned in this column, lots of business gets packed into the waning days of the year. This and next week are no exceptions. The business resumed with the second reading of Ordinance 23-024 establishing the Transportation Benefit District Tab Fee.

On October 24th, Council adopted Ordinance 23-018 forming a Transportation Benefit District (TBD). The TBD authorizes the City, under state law, to establish annual vehicle fees, taxes, and other revenue sources. Allowable uses for TBD funds are transportation improvements that construct, preserve, maintain and operate the existing and future transportation infrastructure of the City.

The newly created TBD is a separate legal entity. At its last meeting, Council adopted Ordinance 23-022, under which the City assumes the rights, powers, functions, and obligations of the TBD. A complete copy of the ordinance can be found on the City website: www.spokanevalleywa.gov.

After Council discussion on funding the TBD to perform its intended use of maintaining City roads, consensus was reached to draft an Ordinance (23-024) establishing an annual vehicle license fee of \$20 and the allowable uses for the funds collected. The motion to adopt Ordinance 23-024 passed 4-3 (Padden/Wick/Peetz-no).

On November 14, 2023, Council reached consensus to expand the use of its available CLFR (Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds) to include non-profits that provide human trafficking prevention. To that end, RFPs (Requests for Proposal) were solicited, with two responses: Lutheran Community Services Northwest, and the Jonah Project. Consideration of those proposals followed the presentation to Council by each entity using the same scoring system as the City's Outside Agency Grants Program. The motion to not award any funds because neither applicant garnered sufficient Council votes to receive an award. The CLFR funds will remain for distribution at Council discretion.

On September 20th, 2022, Spokane Valley City Council established the Spokane Valley Tourism Promotion Area (TPA). Pursuant to the TPA, the Spokane Valley Hotel Commission (Commission) was formed. The Commission hired 116 & West as their marketing consultant. However, 116 & West did not have the qualifications to provide sporting events recruitment and marketing services for the City. Recognizing that, the Commission selected Spokane Sports to provide sports recruitment services. Spokane Sports, by request from the Commission, submitted a proposal to work with 116 & West to round out the package to brand the City as a "host city" for future sports events. That relationship continues through 2024 with the cost for 2024 increasing to \$400,000 from 2023's \$300,000. The motion to approve the new contract passed unanimously.

On October 26th, the City's Lodging Tax Advisory Committee (LTAC) met to receive proposals from applicants and make suggestions for allocations of lodging tax revenues collected for the purpose of promoting conventions and tourist travel to the City. In addition to the usual applications, this year the City of Spokane Valley applied for \$4.4 million to help fund a proposed cross-country track. The allocations made were:

The two categories required two separate motions. Motion #1 was for the approval of the non-City allocations as presented, which passed unanimously. Motion #2 was for the allocation to the Cross-Country track for \$4.4 million. This, too, passed unanimously.

In discussing the City's 2024 Federal Legislative Agenda, the following Capital Projects are:

- 1. The Sullivan/Trent Interchange
- 2. South Barker Road Corridor Projects
- 3. Argonne Bridge at I-90
- 4. Barker/I-90 Interchange

Accompanying the Capital Projects are the following Policy Statements:

- 1. Concern over the unhoused and growing epidemic of substance abuse
- 2. Elimination of obstacles to efficient implementation of federal transportation projects
- 3. Continuation of federal infrastructure partnerships

The motion to approve the 2024 Federal Legislative Agenda as presented passed unanimously.

In a housekeeping vote, Council unanimously approved a new presentation of its previously approved state legislative agenda. The amended presentation is with a different font allowing the entire arrangement to now be on one page front and back. The motion to approve the new form passed unanimously.

The contract for maintaining our parks is up for renewal. With the increase in the size and number of parks together with inflation driven costs for labor and supplies, Council chose to split the single contract into three pieces. When the request for proposals went out, there were three respondents. One eventually dropped out because of the uncertainty of the future cost increases. The other two, Senske Services, who is our current contractor, and Clearwater Summit Group, a Spokane Valley business, both submitted proposals.

The contract for maintaining our linear parks was awarded to Senske Services. The contract for maintaining our "signature" parks (Balfour, Mirabeau) was awarded to Clearwater Summit Group who is also currently involved in the construction of Balfour Park. The third piece, maintenance of the City's "designated" parks, was awarded to Senske. The motion to approve those contract awards passed unanimously.

Each year amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan can be proposed for addition to the Comprehensive Plan Docket. This year, any such amendment had to be submitted prior to November 14th. Two such amendments were proposed, both by the City, and both were map amendments. The first, owned by Spokane Conservation District, is located at 4418 East 8th Avenue and would change 44 acres from Multi-Family Residential to Mixed Use. An additional piece would change 5.2 acres from MFR to Single-Family residential. The second plan amendment would change 0.83 acres owned by Family Promise of Spokane at 17103 E. Main Avenue from SFR to Corridor Mixed Use. A motion consideration is set for December 19th.

Currently, the City contracts with Spokane County for traffic signal, sign, and pavement marking maintenance. The County has up to now been able to meet the needs of the City. However, due to escalating costs and labor shortages, the County will be unable to meet our needs necessitating action by the City to address the problem. Doing so will require, from our assessment of needs, two signal technicians, additional tools and signal equipment, a bucket truck capable of reaching 35' height for year-round use, an additional fleet service vehicle, and an external support contractor for after hours emergency response. The overall additional cost is estimated to be \$5,100. Council reached consensus to continue negotiating a revised interlocal agreement and planning for absorbing the responsibilities of maintaining our own traffic signals.

City Council meetings are held in the Great Room at CenterPlace until further notice. City Hall, however, is open for business during normal business hours. The Public is invited to Council meetings to participate in action items or public comment periods in person or via ZOOM. Fishing Magician

I just barely beat the storm to get my boat moved from Leavenworth to its place to wait out winter till the spring. I will be doing a lot of fishing from the shore or getting rides from friends until things thaw out. I have a pretty good

list of things to do this winter, so let the fun begin!

Checking back on my photos taken a year ago, I found one that was taken at the middle net pens on Rufus Woods Reservoir. It showed Austin Moser and Randy Sykes, on Austin's boat on his first trip to Rufus last year. Austin will often invite me on exploratory missions, and he wanted to see if the fishing for triploids was good enough to book some trips. Yup, we caught some really

nice fish. He had Randy and I try a couple of things, like fishing bait on the bottom, but what worked the best was casting olive-colored jigs. The fish loved them, and we were able to get our limits pretty quickly when we switched to this method. Austin booked a bunch of trips to Rufus last season and caught some real monsters. He had a great time catching walleye on Rufus, too.

Thanks to Austin, Eric Granstrom, Rollie Schmitten, and I caught our triploids on olive jigs on Rufus Woods at the middle net pens last April. It was amazing that the huge triploid that Eric landed was taken on an 1/8th ounce jig. I know that casting jigs along the shore is one of my brother Rick's favorite ways to catch triploids on Rufus. Not only is it effective and fun, but anglers can also release the smaller fish. When using bait all fish landed count toward your limit, whether kept or not. I hope I can get up to Rufus soon. This week's photo is of Austin and Randy Sykes with the first limit of triploids take from Austin's boat last December.

I had a great conversation with Jill Phillips, with the Colville Tribe's Fish and Wildlife Department. I had left a message asking if she knew where all the small trout that were being caught in Rufus Woods were coming from. She said the tribe hadn't released any fish for months and she doubted they came from the commercial net pens on Rufus. Most likely they were coming downstream from Lake Roosevelt. They may have released rainbow from some of the

net pens they operate up there.

She did say that there would be a release of bigger trout by the Colville Tribe sometime in February. These should be 4 to 5 pounds and they will be put in at Seatons Grove and above Chief Joseph Dam in Bridgeport. This should give anglers something to look forward to this winter. Also, she said they plan on releasing the same number of triploids into Rufus Woods as usual next year, which is 45 to 50 thousand

I mentioned my great trips to Omak Lake this year, and she told me a fish that could have been the new state record was taken there last spring.



Going by the length and girth measurement provided by the lucky angler, the Lahontan cutthroat probably weighed over 18 pounds, and would have beat the current record. It was taken during the catch and release part of the fishing season on Omak Lake, so the fish was released and didn't make it to a certified

The weather in Leavenworth has been awful. We got buried in snow and the forecast is for rain. So, my first project is to get all the snow and water off the cover of my boat, and make sure it is drained. My next project is to load my smoker with a new batch of sockeye. We have family from Anaconda, Montana here, and I want to send them home

with some smoked sockeye. I also want to make up some of my salmon spread to enjoy while they are here.

I used to just hand out chunks of smoked fish, and then I started making the salmon spread. People love it so I make sure my family members get some for the Holidays. It's very simple to make. All you need, aside from the smoked fish, is some cream cheese and dill. I crumble up the fish, and here's an important trick. I put the cream cheese in the microwave for three minutes, then it is very easy to mix with the fish and dill. I put it into those 9.5 ounce containers after they have cooled, and

into the fridge. You can microwave the containers for a minute before serving to make the mixture more "spreadable".

Right after the Holidays the annual RV, boat and sportsmen's shows begin. These shows are very popular, as everything that is new for the coming year is on display, and there are usually "show special" pricing available to those who attend. In Washington State, they begin with the Tacoma RV Show, that takes place at the Tacoma Dome on January 18th through the 21st. This is followed by Tri-Cities Sportsmen Show at the HAPO Center in Pasco. It starts on January 26th and runs through the 28th. The biggest sportsman's show in the state is the Washington Sportsmen's Show. It is held at the Washington State Fair Events Center

in Puyallup. It begins on January 31st and stays open through February 4th. Overlapping with the show in Puyallup is the Seattle Boat Show. It's scheduled from February 2nd through the 10th. The main show is at Lumen Field Event Center and Bell Harbor Ma-

There is a lot going on at all of these shows and I will provide you with more information as the opening dates get closer. I have attended most of these shows and have enjoyed them all. When I am not on the "show circuit" I will be out chasing kokanee on Lake Chelan, big trout on Rufus Woods and Lake Roosevelt and when the area lakes freeze, trying my luck for a variety of species through the ice!

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
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


