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### Recent Updates...

### Spokane Valley City Council - February 6, 2024

This regularly scheduled study session of the Spokane Valley City Council commenced with action on Ordinance 24-001 which is a City-initiated code change revising City Code to provide flexibility in the number of required Planning Commission meetings. Currently, City Code requires the Commission to hold at least one regular meeting each month, for not less than nine months each year. Further, it would ensure that there are not two consecutive months without a meeting. The change also includes a provision that the first Planning Commission meeting in election years be canceled to enable new commission members to be appointed. The Planning Commission in 2023, after a public hearing, recommended Council adopt Ordinance 24-001. The motion to advance Ordinance 24-001 to a reading passed unanimously.

The US Department of Transportation (USDOT) issued a call for projects in December 2023 for its Bridge Investment Program (BIP). The program is designed for bridge rehabilitation, preservation, and protection projects. Funding is on a competitive basis with emphasis on safety, efficiency, and reliability of the movement of people and freight over these bridges. Scoring also includes project readiness and cost effectiveness.

City Staff recommend submitting the Sullivan & Trent Interchange Project to this call for projects. The request will be for \$33,587,992. To date the city has secured roughly \$6.6 million for the project and has set aside \$1 million of its own funds. Applications are due by March 19, 2024. The motion to authorize the City Manager to apply for the BIP grant in the amount of \$33,587,992 passed unanimously.

Members of the Spokane Valley Planning Commission are appointed by the Mayor with the approval of Council. At last week's meeting, the Mayor appointed three new members but learned at the time of the meeting of the resignation of Mr. Val Dimitrov. Mayor Haley appointed Matthew Hurd for the remainder of Mr. Dimitrov's term (2 years). The motion for Council to approve Mr. Hurd's appointment did not receive a second and died. The vacant position will shortly be open for applications; check the City web page for details: www.spokanevalleywa.gov.

Spokane Valley Police Chief, Dave Ellis, presented the department's recruiting and retention plan for 2024-2027. The report opened with a summary of these national trends from the Police Executive Research Forum:

In employee retention, compensation packages are reviewed to ensure that Spokane County remains competitive. The recent collective bargaining agreement is making a difference. Retention also includes a tuition reimbursement program, wellness program, and is state legislation permits, a program enabling retired officers to re-enter the force for up to 1040 hours annually. The City is currently engaged in consideration of police force increases and funding to accomplish those increases. Manpower and facilities are foremost among those considerations.

As the commencement of construction on the Pines/BNSF Rail Crossing approaches this year, all of the elements necessary to actually begin construction are coming into place. Foremost among those considerations is finalization of acquisition and consolidation of all the necessary rights-of-way. Staff has coordinated with and is negotiating an agreement which will include construction of the BNSF's parallel bridges, property rights, and a permanent easement for the project.

All properties with the exception of one have been acquired, including three donated by Avista. However, one owner continues to refuse to reach agreement and condemnation proceedings have been filed.

The necessary funding is secured and what remains is the coordination of participating agencies to bring the plan into working fruition. As all pieces come together, the schedule to begin construction is slated for mid-year 2024.

Spokane County is currently accepting requests for proposals for the use of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) entitlement funds for program year 2024. In 2023, the City entered into a cooperation agreement to increase the City's setaside for available funds based on its share of the agreement's consortium population. The presentation tonight is to identify projects that the City could apply for to support providers serving Spokane Valley. Specific action will be taken at a future Council meeting.

Locally, the Sheriff's Office, with whom the City contracts for its law enforcement has averaged losing 25 deputies per year due to retirements, resignations, terminations, change in carers, and other reasons. This does not factor in new hires who failed to complete the year-long probationary period. Currently the Sheriff's Office is offering a \$25,000 signing bonus for lateral transfers and a \$10,000 signing bonus for new recruits.

An aggressive recruiting strategy includes more funding for recruiting events, and a change in County policy to allow bonuses for interagency transfers. That is not currently the County policy, but the City of Spokane does allow payment of the bonus. Also included in the strategy is consideration on how to make hiring easier, faster, and more efficient by making applications easier, move to virtual in-

Next week, on February 13th, Council will be holding its Strategic Planning Workshop starting at 9:45am. The meeting will be in Council Chambers, is open to the public, and is expected to last to 2:45pm. There will not be a Council meeting at the 6:00pm hour.

Spokane Valley City Council meetings are once again held in City Hall, 10210 E. Sprague Avenue, on Tuesdays, commencing at 6:00pm. City Hall is open for regular business during normal business hours (8:00am to 5:00pm). 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# **Fishing Magician**

The weather has warmed up considerably recently, but I chose the coldest day of the week to get out on the water. I want to warn fishermen that the ice is getting thin on the lakes that they were fishing a couple of weeks ago. I suggest looking to do some fishing from shore in the near future.

I promised my friend James Lebow that it would be sunny and warm last Monday. A perfect day to fish for triploids at the net pens on Rufus Woods Reservoir. He got his boat ready and headed out from Moses Lake that morning. He almost wound up in the ditch

a couple of times, due to freezing fog on the road to Pinto Ridge. He made it though, and we made it to the launch at the middle net pens. Still no sunshine. The fog had lifted, but the sun just couldn't break through. We tried fishing on the bottom next to the upper pens and didn't get a bite. We moved toward the shore and made two passes downstream, trolling spinners on bottom walkers. We have had good success doing this, catching both trout and walleye. Not on Monday. No bites. We moved back up to the upper pens and tried fishing bait on the bottom again. It was about 12:30 now, still fogged in, but James got a bite, and landed a trout of about 3 pounds. Ten minutes later, I got a bite and landed a trout that was slightly bigger. No sunshine but we took home

two nice triploids. This week's photo is of me with one of the triploids we caught at the upper net pen.

We are into February now and should be in the depth of winter. It's going to be rainy, and temperatures are in the 40s here in Leavenworth. Ice has gotten thin on most lakes, but it was thick enough on Bonaparte Lake, for the second annual Ice Fishing Derby. In spite of rainy weather and slush and water on the ice, there was a very good turnout. According to Eric Cruz, owner of the Bonaparte Lake Resort and organizer of the derby, there were 560 entries this year. The Big Fish honors went to Idaho angler Brian Rogers with a 4.75-pound rainbow. He won a gift certificate to Sheels and \$1,899. The Multi Species category was won by Chris Marcolin from Omak. He

took home a Vexlar flasher basket and \$1,319. The winner in the Youth division was James Magnuson and he received a Sheels gift certificate and \$397. Eric said that about 200 people came up to him to thank him for putting on the derby, so you can count on the Bonaparte Lake Ice Fishing Derby to be back next year. Plus, Eric said he is working on a derby on Curlew Lake. I'll keep you posted.

While most anglers are looking for places to launch their boats and fish from shore, there are still others out there drilling holes through the ice. On my way back from fishing at the net pens on



Rufus Woods, I pulled into the marina at Coulee City. I noticed some fishing shacks out on the ice at Banks Lake on my way to meet my friend at Big Wally's and I wanted to check on the ice conditions. When I pulled up on the dike there were two anglers loading up their sled to head out. I learned that there was about six inches of ice, and they were looking forward to fishing through the night for whitefish. I thought that the people I saw out there were fishing for perch, but no, whitefish are the target. I know that ice anglers make excellent catches of whitefish through the ice at the very top end of Banks Lake but didn't know they were available in such great numbers at the bottom end. Whitefish make up about 50 percent of the biomass on Banks, so I

guess it makes sense. Still, I think the ice is too thin to tempt me out there.

There are two events coming up on the weekend of February 17th. On the east side of the mountains is the Okanogan Valley Bass Club awards banquet and fund raising dinner. I attended this banquet many years ago, and what I remember about it was being very welcomed by the members. Many people aren't aware of the amazing bass fishing on the Okanogan River. There are miles and miles of great habitat for smallmouth bass. I have had some great days fishing at Monse and Mallot. I even floated from Oroville down to Tonasket once, fly fishing

for smallmouth. The biggest smallmouth I have ever caught was at the Monse Bridge. If you want to learn more about the terrific bass fishing available in Okanogan County, it would be a great idea to get to know the folks in this group. To find out how to get tickets to the event, visit the Okanogan Valley Bass Club Facebook page. The deadline for ticket sales in Saturday, February 10th.

If you are a fly fisher, there's an event especially for you scheduled for February 17th and 18th. It's the annual Seattle Fly Fishing Show that is held at the Meydenbauer Center in Bellevue. At the show you can see fly tying and casting demonstrations and attend seminars and classes. The International Fly Fishing Film Festival starts on Friday, February 17th at 6 p.m. You can see all the newest products and visit exhibitors from lodges, resorts, and exotic vacation destinations. There's \$60,000 in door prizes given out at this year's show. You can get all the details by visiting www.flyfishingshow.com.

One more event that you should know about is the annual Central Washington Sportsmen Show in Yakima. It will take place on February 23rd to the 25th at the Sundome. 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### ——— Department of Ecology News Release MANAGING HIGH WATER AND FLOODING AT SPRAGUE LAKE

### New Hydrology Study Provides Recommendations

The challenges of high water and flooding around Sprague Lake are complex. To help unravel the issues and identify flood risk solutions, the state legislature directed funds to us, in partnership with Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW).

Now, an extensive new hydrology study over the past year, conducted by a private consulting firm, recommends focusing on flood preparedness planning, temporary flood-fighting techniques, zoning, and building code enforcement.

"We know how difficult recurring high-water levels and flooding have been for those around Sprague Lake," said Brook Beeler, Ecology's Eastern Region director. "The results and recommendations from this study provide a science-based path forward that will help the community be better prepared for future events."

### **Results and Recommendations**

The hydrology study found that most of the rainwater carried by Sprague Lake's main tributary, Negro Creek, goes underground, and only a small amount stays on the surface. Long periods of heavy rain or spring snowmelt are the main causes of high-water levels in the lake, which limits the lake's capacity to accommodate additional flow from Negro Creek. Because of this, the study looked at different ways to prevent flooding, including making Cow Creek wider or changing the piping infrastructure of a water-control structure located at the lake's Cow Creek outlet. The study also explored bigger changes, like creating an 80-foot-wide channel or a bypass channel between the Sprague Lake outlet and Danekas Road.

"As a manager of land on Sprague Lake, WDFW remains committed to working with the local community to find a solution to the flooding issue that has impacted the area," said Brock Hoenes, regional director for WDFW's North Central – Region 2.

The study recommends that to help protect property and infrastructure in the event of flooding, the City of Sprague and Lincoln and Adams counties (Sprague Lake straddles the county line) could instead further the strategies identified in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers 2020 report, City of Sprague Nonstructural Flood Mitigation Assessment. These include:



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Ultimately, the study found these options may not be effective enough to be worth the environmental impact or expense because the large-scale structural solutions are not anticipated to result in more than nominal improvements.

- Flood preparedness planning
- Developing temporary flood fighting techniques
- Developing and enforcing local zoning and building codes that reduce flood risk
  Non-structural flood mitigation measures

### **NEED TO REHAB** YOUR WELL?



It is common for some water wells to experience loss of production and experience a loss of water quality over time. Minerals in the water can create fouling deposits on rock, gravel pack and well screens that will reduce the optimum flow of the well. It could take a few years or may take many years for that flow to be reduced to the point that it is noticeable and measurable.

When wells are high in minerals such as iron or calcium, property owners frequently install filters that mitigate the effects of those minerals, especially those that affect taste, smell and create visible staining, but the well and plumbing structures on the front side of that filter system can still be adversely affected and therefore may need reliable "unplugging" efforts to be restored to its original working capacity.

There are well rehabilitation companies that specialize in restoring original water volumes and quality. Effective well rehabilitation requires removal of all those deposits of collected material allowing capacity and volume to be restored.

One of the most effective treatment processes is the use of liquid carbon dioxide because of its ability to effectively disrupt and remove a wide variety of mineral deposits in many different types of well structures. It offers superior deposit removal without adversely effecting well construction.

This process can be used in vertical or horizontal wells, shallow wells or very deep wells, small diameter to large diameter wells. Many of the wells treated are rock formations like granite, dolomite, limestone, basalt and sandstone.

The success of CO2 treatment results from a combination of carbonic acid agitation, and localized freezing, which results in disruption and detachment of encrusted material. The agitation from the liquid CO2 is similar to when dry ice is placed in water. Because this process is not overly aggressive, it is effective without causing damage to well components. Most companies also offer mechanical rehab methods such as wire brushing, swabbing and simultaneous airlift swabbing.

Certain permanently installed energy injection equipment can also be installed that allows for routine and consistent treatment. This type of treatment is efficient and possibly more economical than other treatments because well and geological formation surfaces are kept clean resulting in better raw water quality. All such treatments can be accomplished with the pump and pipe in place.

In wells that experience severe and rapid fouling, periodic treatment or permanently installed treatment systems offer a financial and efficiency benefit from the

In the Holiday Classic at the fifth-mile Tucson Kart Speedway run Dec. 28-30, Berry shook off problems the first two days and captured the 20-lap Saturday feature, again in KT100.

"Thursday we had to pull off, Friday I ran second to the boss, Bryan Nevins Jr.," Berry wrote in a Facebook post. "Saturday I made the last minute choice to bolt 50 pounds of lead on and run KT Super Heavy.'

Nevins and Berry once again had a notable race. "He pushed me the whole way (liter-

Team driver, Kily Fleming, joined Berry on the trip and was one of Berry's earliest crew guys when he drove sprint cars.

"He bought karts for he and his daughter to race at Sunset," Berry said. "A couple of years later, he bought a kart with a KT100 on it and enticed me to get back in the seat."

Berry decided he wanted to get back in karting in a bigger way and has been building the program to compete at a high level.

The Tucson trip and win was somewhat of a scouting trip for Berry who plans to run the UAS (Unlimited All Stars) Nationals at the track in September.

"We don't have much planned yet for the summer," Berry said. "I am trying to put together a four race KT series in the region and we plan to run as many UAS races as we can in both our region and the neighboring ones in Idaho, Colorado and California."
