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

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

Recent Updates...

Spokane Valley City Council - April 2, 2024

This meeting of the Spokane Valley City Council opened with Mayor Haley proclaiming April 1 through April 5 as National Public Health Week in recognition of contributions made in achieving public health improvements.

That proclamation was followed by three motion considerations pertaining to City business. The first of those was the awarding of the bid for the 16th Avenue Preservation project. That project extends from Evergreen Road to Adams Road, providing curb extensions to reduce pedestrian crossing distances near a school, upgrading existing curb ramps to current ADA standards, installing an ITS (Internet telecommunications system) infrastructure, and a complete grind and overlay of the asphalt pavement.

The Engineer's Estimate for the construction was \$1,217,979. The lowest of the three submitted bids was \$1,115,000 made by Shamrock Paving, Inc. The total budget for the construction plus ancillary charges is \$1,475,250. The motion to award the 16th Avenue Preservation Project to Shamrock Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$1,115,000 passed unanimously. Councilmember Padden was excused for the evening.

The Commute Trip Reduction (CTR) was enacted by the State Legislature in 1991 to address traffic congestion, air pollution, and petroleum fuel consumption. It requires employers with 100 or more employees to develop incentives for carpooling. The act also requires local governments in urban areas with traffic congestion to develop programs that reduce drive-alone trips and vehicle miles travelled per capita.

The City and Spokane County have operated since 2003 under an interlocal agreement that provides for the County to retain the City's state issued CTR funds in return for the County's development of an overall CTR program. The existing agreement expires every two years. This agreement once again extends the agreement for another two years. The motion to authorize the City Manager to finalize and execute the 2023-2025 Interlocal Agreement for Spokane County Commute Trip Reduction Services passed 6-1 (Merkel-no).

The 2022 South Barker Corridor Study recommended several traffic and multi-modal improvements on South Barker Road from the south city limits to Mission Avenue. Engineering has completed the preliminary engineering and environmental work associated with those improvements south of Appleway Boulevard. The improvements will provide for widening Barker Road from two to three lanes for center turn lanes, installation of bike lanes, stormwater improvements, curbs, and sidewalks. Also included are conversions from stop sign-controlled intersections at 4th and 8th Avenues to single lane roundabouts. A similar interchange was completed at Sprague and Barker in 2022.

To complete the plan, an additional right of way (ROW) will be needed. Existing ROW varies between 60-65 feet in width. A 70-foot ROW is needed to accommodate the proposed sidewalk, storm water, and road improvements. All of this land acquisition must be done in compliance with the federal Uniform Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 as amended which requires certification for each separate project. To achieve compliance with the requirements, the City is hiring Epic Land Solutions, Inc. The commensurate fee is \$675,572. The motion to authorize the City Manager to finalize and execute the agreement passed 6-1 (Merkel-no).

Spokane County has accepted requests for proposals for the use of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) entitlement funds for program year 2024. In 2023, the City entered into a cooperation agreement to increase the City's set-aside for available funds based on its share of the agreement's consortium population. This evening's presentation is to identify projects that the City could apply for to support providers serving Spokane Valley. The County has received total requests of \$21.5 million. Discussion to arrive at recommendation to the County Commissioners for their formal action will be made at Council's April 11th meeting.

In November 2021, the City, through Ordinance 21-022, granted Yellowstone Pipe Line Company a 25-year franchise to construct, maintain and, and operate its petroleum products pipeline in the City's rights-of-way. In finalizing the design for the Pines Road/BNSF rail crossing it became clear that the location of the underpass would materially interfere with the current location of Yellowstone's facilities, which have existed since 1952. Changing the route of that pipeline can be accomplished by rerouting through property purchased by the City but the change requires amending the existing franchise agreement. Consensus was reached to bring the amended agreement (Ordinance 24-006) to a first reading at a future Council meeting.

The City contracts for many of the services requiring specialized departments and/or large staffs such as its police force which it contracts with the Spokane

County Sheriff. In its latest agreement (2023) with the Sheriff's Office, the City has 91 dedicated officers together with 37 commissioned officers that are shared with the County. There are other positions included in supervision that may cause that number to fluctuate.

There are six patrol districts in the City, and the police are required to provide a minimum of one patrol officer per district on duty at all times. That number has, in current circumstances, been difficult and, at times, impossible to achieve. Calls for service remained relatively stable between 2004 and 2011. However, since 2011, calls for service have increased 63% resulting in longer response times.

A 2023 study completed by Matrix, a consultant hired by the City, has recommended that 25 dedicated commissioned officers be added to the City police force, plus three shared commissioned officers and two civilian administrative positions.

Realizing that the recommendation is impractical to achieve immediately, Police Chief Dave Ellis advises that the additional officers be added in increments of 8-12 positions starting in 2024 and moving through 2026. The total estimated cost to reach full staffing is \$6.2 million. That figure does not include expenses that will be incurred in improving facilities to accommodate the increased staff. Realistically, an initial hire of 10 officers is the goal. Ideally, five of those officers would be new hires and five would be lateral transfers. Even with the limited number of new hires, a likely increase in arrests will result in increased costs in courts, public defenders, prosecutor, and jail services.

The City has budgeted \$35,250,000 for public safety in 2024. Law Enforcement is the direct recipient of \$29,627,000 of that amount. Adding to the financial shock of such a dramatic personnel and equipment increase, in 2023, the deputies' union reached agreement on a new contract to 'catch up' on past wages with increases over the next few years to bring wages on par with surrounding jurisdictions. That change is a rising cost not currently addressed with any dedicated funding source from the City. While recognition is given to the critical need for additional law enforcement personnel and facilities, funding must be found in order to make any substantive changes possible.

Simply put, the City does not have in its current budget the estimated \$4.34 million needed to fund ongoing costs for the remaining 19 positions either now or beyond.

Discussions on suggested funding measures have included a property tax increase or a utility tax. Neither met with Council support. What did garner interest was an increase of 0.1% in the sales tax. Such a tax could produce an estimated \$2.8 million based on 2023 sales tax collections. A sales tax increase would also collect funds from non-Valley citizens who shop here. Council deferred action to ascertain citizen input.

This issue is vitally important and is the focus of the City's newly created Public Safety Committee. That committee has been reviewing the available information to develop a strategy to guide Council and the Valley citizens for moving forward. One aspect of the committee's work has been to establish 'listening sessions' in the community to gather citizen input. The problem requires your input. Please stop by Tuesday, April 9th, from 11AM to 12:30PM in the CenterPlace 2nd floor lounge; or Wednesday, April 17th, from 1 to 2:30PM at the Spokane Valley Library.

There are also Community Conversations for Q & As. Those are: Thursday, April 11 from 8-9:30AM at CenterPlace or via ZOOM. You can register through the Greater Spokane Valley Chamber of Commerce for this date only. Or you can attend on Monday, April 15 from 5 to 7PM at the Centennial Middle School gym.

By now, you should have received a mailed notice with information on how to participate in voicing your opinion on shaping Spokane Valley's police through either taking the survey or attending one of the listed meetings. This is your opportunity to make your thoughts known.

Should Council decide to place a ballot measure on the August 6 election, it will need to approve the required election ordinance by Apil 23rd. If you haven't received a mailed notice and wish to participate, please go to the City website, www.spokanevalleywas.gov, for more information.

Please note: There will be a special Council meeting next Tuesday, April 9, starting at 5:00pm at City Hall.

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

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
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ACTIVITY AT THE SPOKANE VALLEY CITY COUNCIL



Fishing Magician

April has started with wonderful weather. You need to get your new fishing license if you want to get out on the year-round lakes, to practice for the general opening of the lowland lakes trout season, which is the fourth Saturday of April. Meanwhile, there are walleye and bass to fish for. They are starting to wake up on our area reservoirs.

When I want to know what's happening on Potholes Reservoir in the early spring, I can always call Shelby Ross. If there are walleye to be caught he will know. There are a lot of anglers that look forward to the walleye fishing on Potholes and they will be glad to hear that

fish are being caught. Shelby put eleven walleye in the boat recently and he noted that they were all males. He figures the big females are spawning and won't be feeding for a while. He said there are a few anglers jigging for the walleye, but he prefers to troll spinners and bottom bouncers. That way he is covering more water. I was fishing with my friend Brian Neilson in his boat. It looks like we were in Lind Coulee, which is a great place to start on Potholes in the spring. I often find fish in the Coulee and then just out of the mouth of the Coulee at Perch Point.

I talked to Nic Alexander, one of the organizers of the Banks Lake Triple Fish Challenge, the other day. He was busy getting sponsors for the event, and rattled off the names of several companies that were already providing prizes. There are always plenty of great things being awarded to those who are winners in the derby. Whether they are winners or not, the kids always get something for being a part of the event. The Banks Lake Triple Fish Challenge starts on Friday, April 12th, with lots of things planned for the youngsters. The highlight is the "trout pond" that is set up off the beach at Coulee Playland. Thanks to Pacific Seafoods, the pond is loaded with fat rainbow for the kids to catch. In addition to the trout pond, there will be casting instructions, a s'more station, face painting, gold panning, food vendors and even live music. The fun starts at 1 p.m. and lasts till 5 p.m. On Saturday the tournament begins, and anglers will be out looking for trout, bass, walleye, and whitefish. You can learn more about the Banks Lake Triple Fish Challenge and even register in advance by going to the Reel Recreation

Nic Alexander, one of the organizers with Reel Recreation thought it would be fun to make a run at getting a "triple fish" and give anglers some pointers on how to do it. He recruited Austin Moser and me to fish with him to catch a walleye, bass, and trout in the same day. We started our day looking for walleye and Austin took us to one of his favorite areas between



Steamboat Rock and Barker Canyon and Nic got a nice walleye fishing with bottom bouncers and spinners. A green sparkly Smile Blade in fifty feet of water was the best lure. With that done we tried for smallmouth bass. Nic directed us to some of the areas he catches smallmouth, on jigs and jerk baits, and we worked our way up to Osborne Bay. We were casting to the broken rock along the highway when a smallmouth grabbed the Senko I was dragging across the bottom. Now we just needed to get a trout. Austin ran out a variety of crank baits on side planers at the very top end of Banks and Nic reeled in a dandy rainbow. Yea! We did it! Better yet, I shot a video of how we did it, and you can find it on the Dave Graybill YouTube channel. Look for the one that says Banks Lake Triple Fish Challenge. It should be at the top of the playlist.

It's April and if you are an avid angler you need to renew your fishing license for the season. Fishing licenses are valid from April 1st to March 31st of the following year. If you aren't in a hurry, and don't plan to fish until the opening of the general lowland lakes season, you can get your license online. Just log into fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov. Your documents will arrive in about 10 days. I usually go to a local authorized dealer, as I want to get the two pole endorsement and a salmon punch card, which can't be obtained online. I don't get the Discovery Pass, as I buy the Washington State Parks Natural Investment sticker for my windshield. For an annual fee of \$80. It is interchangeable between vehicles and

> covers my parking and launch fees at State Parks. I also buy Colville Tribal licenses and permits. These are only available online. Log onto cct.fnw. com and go to the Licenses and Permits page. You will need to have your driver's license and vehicle license plate numbers to complete the transaction. This week's photo is of Park and Blue lakes.

As many of you know, I am a big fan of fishing on the Colville Reservation lakes.

The Colville Tribe plant fish in Rufus Woods, Buffalo, Omak, and Twin lakes every year, and some of them are real whoppers. The tribe has already planted over 16,000 trout in Rufus Woods and will release an additional 30,000, averaging two pounds, in April and May. Twin lakes will be planted with 7,500 trout averaging 1.5 pounds in April and get 600 rainbow that average 7 pounds the same month. Twin Lakes also offers terrific fishing for largemouth bass. Buffalo Lake will receive a plant of 2,000 rainbow averaging 1.5 pounds in April and 600 trout that will weigh 7 pounds in April and May. Buffalo Lake also has very good numbers of kokanee and a crawfish season from July 1st through September 15th, and they are of exceptional size. Rufus Woods Lake produces triploid rainbow that can exceed 20 pounds and the state record from Rufus is 29.6 pounds. The state record for Lahontan cutthroat is from Omak Lake. It weighed 18.4 pounds.



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

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HOLD THAT SMOKE: WHY WE CALL BURN BANS - PART 1



Wood stove smoke is the primary cause of air pollution in Washington during winter.


Today, everyone is painfully aware of the air pollution caused by wildfire smoke during our lengthening summers. But you may not know as much about the other polluting smoke that happens in our state during the opposite time of the year. It comes from wood stoves, fireplaces, and other wood-burning appliances.

Residential burning to stay warm is the main activity that creates fine particle air pollution in Washington in winter, and it puts out hundreds of times more air pollution than other heat sources, such as natural gas and electricity.

As Hazardous as Smoking Cigarettes

"Wood smoke is the result of combustion and creates particles so small they can be inhaled deeply into lungs," says Paul Rossow, air quality specialist in the Washington Department of Ecology's Eastern Regional Office. "Once they get there, they don't come out, similar to cigarette smoke."

Ecology's statewide air monitoring network monitors two types of particle pollution: particulate matter (PM) 10, which are particles less than 10 micrometers in size, and PM2.5, which are fine particles less than 2.5 micrometers in size – much smaller than the diameter of a human hair.

Some of the long-term health effects of breathing in these particles from wood smoke include bronchitis, emphysema, and cancer. In fact, Ecology estimates that fine particle pollution in Washington kills more than 1,100 people every year. And that is why – when our network shows PM2.5 levels going up in one or more of our jurisdictions – we call a burn ban in the affected area.

ORANGE (101-150)

Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (USG) Sensitive groups should take steps to reduce exposure. Limit time outside, avoid strenuous outdoor activity, and follow tips for cleaner indoor air. Everyone should watch for symptoms as a sign to reduce exposure.



The Art (and Science) of Calling a Burn Ban

Winter burn bans are usually needed in October through March, with weather conditions determining how far into spring the burn ban season lasts.

Weather also plays a big role in pollution levels. During a temperature inversion, warm air high in the atmosphere acts like a lid, keeping cold air and pollution near the ground. This may trap unhealthy levels of smoke from wood stoves and fireplaces, triggering a burn ban to improve the air quality and protect public health.

As Ecology's lead air quality modeler and forecaster, Beth Friedman is one of a handful of people who decide whether a burn ban should be called, and for how long. Over the past six years, she and her colleagues have called an average of four burn bans a year.

While the criteria for calling a burn ban are codified in state law, predicting when to call one is a bit of an art. It requires analyzing a range of tools and resources, including Washington's Air Monitoring Network, AirNow's Fire and Smoke Map, weather forecasts, and satellite and webcam imagery, as well as assessments and collaboration with experts in the field.

Friedman sums it up well: "In general, we check the air quality monitors as well as weather forecasts to understand if PM2.5 is forecasted to be greater than 35 micrograms per cubic meter within the next 48 hours."

It's one thing to know when air pollution has exceeded 35 ug/m3, but what does that look and feel like?

"It might be a little hazy outside with reduced visibility, and the air might smell smoky," says Friedman. "It's also the minimum concentration that corresponds to 'Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups' on the Air Quality Index. Some people might experience symptoms, including burning eyes, coughing, and throat and nose irritation."



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
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But not so fast! Material facts consist of only those issues that adversely affect the physical condition of or title to the property.





- Pro Street-Street Freaks, big tires, big motors, 70s straight axle big tire street cars to the 80s-90's Pro Street stuff with some modern big tire entries mixed in. Lots of horsepower in one area.
- And the Car Club Display Challenge! Get your club involved and set up a fun themed display of your own and compete with other clubs for the Best Club Display Award. (Availability is limited.)
- Oh...NitroFest!!! Ya' we will have a few cars burning some race fuel, alcohol and nitromethane for you to see, feel and smell both Friday and Saturday. It's an experience!

Headlining the lineup of celebrity guests is Erik Estrada from the 70s TV show CHiPs. Estrada will make appearances all three days and be joined by American Graffiti Candy Clark "Debbie," Charlie Martin Smith "Toad" and John D'Agostino of Celebrity Customs.

This show fills the void left when the Spokane Auto Boat Speed Show closed in 2012. Formed by custom car and racing icons, Orville Moe and Don Wilbur in 1963, "The Spring Spectacular" as it was nicknamed ran for 49 years and jammed the fairgrounds with cars and fans for up to four days.

Moe passed away in 2015 and Wilbur in the fall of 2016.

Anderson is more than just the front-man to the Speed and Custom Show.

His father, Glenn, was a longtime judge at the former show, and Anderson himself followed in dad's footsteps. "I grew up in town and my dad's a long-time car guy and well connected with hot rods and that kind of stuff," Anderson said. Glenn Anderson judged all but the final two shows.

Anderson said he began hanging out and judging the old Auto Boat Speed Show in about 1986.

"By '88 I was a full-fledged ISCA judge on my own," Anderson said, referencing the International Show Car Association that officiates car shows across the globe.

When the Spokane show dissolved there was a hole left in the car community, Anderson said prior to the inaugural event. "I think they are ready for it to come back," he said at the time of the first show.

Like most new ventures there were plenty of growing pains including having a promoter partnership dissolve just as the first show was coming together.

"Before the first of the year I'm the last man standing with this thing," Anderson said.

Anderson said he "Had been jumping up and down waving a flag for six months about a car show and I wasn't ready to quit."

Not long into his run, like everyone else, COVID intervened and cancelled a pair of shows. But it has continued to prosper and grow from the initial 150 entries.

"About any genre of car you can imagine," Anderson said will be included in the show.

Admission: Pre-sale tickets are \$12 each and skip the line. General admission at the show is \$15.

It's becoming a go-to pattern for kitchens and bathrooms, but the "typically horizontally zigs are beginning to zag in new directions—diagonally or vertically—to create an updated look with visual interest, movement and texture," the Houzz report says.

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
