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

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

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SPOKANE VALLEY CITY COUNCIL | TUESDAY, JUNE 24, 2025 | MEETING RECAP

This week's Spokane Valley City Council meeting began with an invocation, the pledge of allegiance and approval of the following meeting agenda. A motion to excuse Mayor Pam Haley and Councilmember Ben Wick passed unanimously.

Proclamation

Deputy Mayor Hattenburg presented RaeAnna Victor and Cindy Lundberg of the local chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution with a proclamation commemorating the United States 250th anniversary.

General Public Comments

Each week, community members can address Councilmembers for up to three minutes during the General Public Comment period, either at the beginning or end of each meeting, in-person or on Zoom.

ACTION ITEMS

1. Consent Agenda

The Council voted 4 to 1 to approve the consent agenda, which included vouchers for paying city expenses and payroll and Resolution #25-011, Declaring Which Qualified Public Depositories the City is Authorized to Conduct Financial Transactions with, Declaring Which Council Members and City Officers Have Signing Authority Pursuant to Spokane Valley Municipal Code 3.55.010.

2. Second Reading: Ordinance 25-011, Endangerment with a Controlled Substance

This item was previously discussed at the May 6 and June 3, 2025, Council meetings. The proposed city ordinance would address a gap in current state law by making it a gross misdemeanor to knowingly or recklessly permit a child or dependent person to ingest, inhale, absorb or have contact with a controlled substance. The Council discussed expanding the scope of the ordinance to public transportation operators, law enforcement, and others. They ultimately voted to table the motion to explore potential changes. The item will come forward for action at the July 8 Council meeting.

It was noted that revisions will not require any rightof-way acquisitions.

A motion to authorize the city manager to finalize and execute the attached change order with Liberty Concrete LLC in the amount of \$408,250.53 passed with 4 votes in favor and 1 vote against.

4. C.O.P.S. CHP Grant Opportunity for Police Hiring

The Council received a report on this topic on June 17, 2025. Should the City receive the grant award in full, it would provide a maximum of \$125,000 per new law enforcement officer, spread over a three-year period; there is a minimum 25% local match requirement. Spokane Valley applied for this grant in 2024 and was awarded \$1.25 million, which is being applied to fund a portion of the ten additional police officer positions added in 2025. While Spokane Valley doesn't usually use grant funding for recurring expenses, in this instance, staff believe City Council's priorities and goals related to public safety align well with the purposes of this grant.

A motion to authorize the city manager, or designee, to execute and submit all required documents to apply for the 2025 Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Hiring Program (HP) grant through the U.S. Department of Justice for hiring up to ten additional officers, and for the Deputy Mayor to sign the letter of support to be provided with the application passed with unanimously.

5. Memorandum of Understanding with Joint Personnel Recovery Agency (JPRA) for Training within Spokane Valley

This item was discussed at the June 17, 2025, Council meeting. JPRA and 336 Training Group of the Air Force (collectively referred to as JPRA) approached the City requesting authorization to conduct personnel training within Spokane Valley. The training is part of military personnel training in specialized survival, evasion, resistance and escape within urban environments. Staff have negotiated a MOU with JPRA for Council's consideration, primarily to ensure thorough communica-

the property was listed for sale. In May 2025, the property was re-appraised at \$340,000; on June 17, 2025, the City received an offer for \$340,000. Closing costs are estimated at approximately \$26,000.

A motion to authorize the city manager to finalize and execute any documents necessary to sell the Best Road Property in the amount of \$340,000 and pay applicable closing costs passed unanimously.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

7. Gabriel's Challenge

Ms. Kitara Johnson-Jones, discussed Gabriel's Challenge, a five-week initiative to encourage families, churches, businesses, community members and government leaders to respond together to address the fentanyl crisis. Gabriel's Challenge is a 36-day grassroots response to Spokane's fentanyl crisis, rooted in unity, compassion, and coordinated community action. Named for 24-year-old Gabriel Fensler, who died from fentanyl poisoning in March 2025, the Challenge mobilized families, leaders, and neighbors across Spokane County to take action.

8. Fireworks Enforcement

Spokane Valley Assistant Police Chief Sean Walter spoke about the current city code prohibiting the sale, possession and use of fireworks within the city limits. Walter provided the number of calls for service related to fireworks over the past five years. This year, the Spokane Valley Police Department and Spokane Valley Fire Department are working collaboratively to deal with fireworks and related incidents.

The City completed the abatement in 2022 and filed foreclose on its judgement. The property was auctioned, and the City was the highest bidder in 2022. After surplussing the property in March 2024 and appraising the property at \$400,000,

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


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

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I enjoyed a couple of days of fun of Banks Lake earlier this week. This is such a great place to spend a day on the water. The basalt cliffs of the Moses Coulee offer great views. It's a big lake, about 26 miles long, so there's room for a lot of boats. I have several favorite spots, but there are many more that I need to explore for both walleye, bass and whitefish.

Tom Verschueren loves to fish Banks Lake with me. It's such a scenic place and if often provides us with a memorable day of fishing. He loves to fish for smallmouth bass on Banks, but we wanted to dedicate some time to walleye fishing. I fished here with my daughter on Monday, and we only

daughter on Monday, and we only got three small keepers. Thursday was different. We drove the Smoker Craft to the Clay Banks or sand flats just below Steamboat Rock, deployed the Minn Kota and soon had a couple of the "just legal" walleye that have been common this season. Then we got a surprise. Tom landed a walleye that was 22 inches. Not long after that we got a 19 incher! We couldn't believe our luck-and then it got better. I landed a 25 inch walleye! We released this one and after a no-fish loop through the area, went smallmouth bass fishing. We started directly across the lake from the Million Dollar Mile boat launch and started casting Baby Brush Hogs to the sunken rock along the shore. We proceeded to catch and release over 30 smallmouth, including several 2- to 3 pounders. It was a great finish to our day. This week's photo is of me with the 25-incher we released.

When my daughter Whitney comes to visit, one of our favorite things to do is go fishing at Banks Lake. She caught onto catching smallmouth bass many years ago and followed that with having very good luck catching big walleye. So, when she came over from Seattle for Father's Day, we already knew we would be on Banks the following day. This year we launched the Bob Feil Boats and Motors Smoker Craft at Steamboat Rock State Park instead of Northrup, so she could try outdo her catch of a whopper walleye in Devils Punchbowl. We had a bunch of bites in the Punchbowl, but didn't hook anything, so we ran around Steamboat to the sand flats above The Poplars. Just a couple of bites here, too, so off we went to Barker Flats. Whitney landed a nice smallmouth bass, and we also got a small walleye here. We both like to fish the Million Dollar Mile stretch below Rosebush, and that was our next destination. As soon as we arrived, we were into walleye. We landed a few small fish and got a lot of bites here. We finished our day across the lake having fun catching smallmouth. We had a great time!

Walleye fishing can be good one day and poor the next. That's not unusual. I remember many years ago my brother



Rick calling me saying that we needed to get up to Banks the next day. Our cousin Greg and he had a terrific day catching walleye and we needed to get in on the action. So, my wife Eileen and I got up early, picked him up and headed for the spot on Banks that had been super productive the day before. Guess what. We caught two smallmouth bass and one perch! Talk about "you should have been there yesterday." Being the eternal optimist that I am, and many anglers are, I am going back to Banks to give it another try. The great thing about Banks is that if the walleye aren't biting you can always have a blast catching smallmouth bass.

Fans of fishing for Lahontan cutthroat trout mark their calendars for June 1st, when Grimes Lake opens to fishing. Grimes has a short season, closing at the end of August. Anglers reach Grimes from the town of Mansfield. It is known to produce some very large Lahontan cutts and is one of several selective gear-rule lakes in the state that has this special species. Many anglers are aware of the good Lahontan fishing at Lake Lenore, which is

the most easily accessed of these lakes. The east shore is bordered by Highway 17, just up the road from Soap Lake. There are two Lahontan cutthroat lakes in Okanogan County. Blue Lake, which is a 120 acre lake, northeast of Wanacut Lake outside of Tonasket. The other is Albright Lake, which is just 21 acres in size. Albright is accessed from the Lime Lakes road. Anglers should be aware of winterkills that have impacted Albright, and that a fire burned the surrounding area in 2014. Sprague Lake, which straddles Adams and Lincoln counties, is popular for several species including Lahontan cutthroat. Selective gear rules do not apply at Sprague. My favorite is Omak Lake, on the Colville Indian Reservation. In spite of the launching issues, the number and size of the cutthroat we get on Omak Lake makes it worth it.

I have mentioned before that Bob Feil Boats and Motors is sponsoring several events this summer, and I have taken the Smoker Craft along to show it off. I have already been to the Classy Chassis in East Wenatchee, the Manson Apple Blossom Parade, the Quincy Chamber of Commerce Trout Derby, the Touch a Truck in Wenatchee, and the Quincy Pike Minnow Derby at Crescent Bar. I recently returned to Crescent Bar for the second annual Celebration of the Opening Day of Boating Season and Boat Parade. This year's theme was "Pirates", and participants were encouraged to decorate their boats and dress accordingly. The boats lined up in the channel near the Marina and then proceeded by the judges and under the bridge, which was packed with a crowd that shouted and waved as they passed through to the Columbia River. The participants went all out this year with some amazing decorations and costumes. The crew from Bob Feil Boats and Motors got into the swing of things and mine was one of their three boats in the parade. Terrific fun! The Crescent Bar Association did a great job hosting the event and have big plans for next year.

Next week I will be traveling to northern Okanogan County to continue my video project. It will be great capturing some of the terrific lakes in this region. I hope you enjoy learning about them.







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

BOUNDARY DISPUTES



Some property owners are alarmingly indifferent about dealing with boundary disputes or encroachments, as if they can pass such a problem on to the next buyer with no regrets. Maybe they think that they have lived with it for so many years that a new buyer can live with it too! That would be much like the cancer victim that refuses to go to the doctor, thinking that if he doesn't know about it then the problem doesn't exist. This cavalier attitude could cause a costly mistake which may come back to bite when they least expect it.

I wish that a simple handshake would be honored today as it was in the past, such as in a verbal boundary line agreement between neighbors, but we live in a different world now! The precision of new surveying technology has made some of these informal agreements more difficult to tolerate, since it is easier to define exactly where a boundary line should be. Because of this technology and litigious attitudes of our modern day society, buyers are less likely to accept a situation that is unclear or undefined, or disputed.

In one situation, it was brought to a seller's attention that their driveway and garage were probably on someone else's property. Their agent discovered this discrepancy by accessing available aerial photos. The seller scoffed at this discovery as if it wasn't a big deal, when they probably should have been concerned and taken immediate steps to find out for sure, so that a solution could be found sooner, rather than later, when it could cost them a sale.

In another situation one of the conditions of sale for a large timbered parcel was that the seller would mark and identify the boundary lines. This was to be accomplished by a surveyor prior to closing. A few days before closing it was revealed to the new buyer that the old fence lines that surrounded the property were nowhere near the real boundary lines and the surveyor had marked the real boundary lines with ribbons. The buyer was satisfied and closed the deal even though they knew that the adjoining property owner may become agitated by this revelation. A domino effect of controversy began when the neighbor discovered the new ribbons, and now the ripples of litigation have reached back in time to four previous owners.





BRISCOE OUTLASTS HAMLIN AT POCONO By Holly Cain-NASCAR Wire Service

Pocono (Penn.) June 22, 2025 – Chase Briscoe has earned a NASCAR Cup Series season-best four pole positions and led laps in eight races in his first season driving the famous No. 19 Joe Gibbs Racing Toyota, and finally - finally - on Sunday afternoon that hard work translated into his first trophy, edging his JGR teammate Denny Hamlin in The Great American Getaway 400 presented by VisitPA.com at Pocono Raceway.

It came down to the suspenseful very final laps, Briscoe having to save as much fuel as possible while maintaining the lead the last 34 laps with Pocono's all-time winningest driver Hamlin and a two-time Pocono winner, Team Penske's Ryan Blaney directly in his rearview mirror, pushing him lap after lap.

But Briscoe did it – perfectly executing throttle control to maintain the lead and not run his Toyota Camry out of gas - ultimately beating Hamlin across the line by .682-second to formally punch his winand-in 2025 Playoff ticket.

The 30-year-old Indiana-native led a race best 72 of the 160 laps on the day and even had enough fuel for the well-deserved victory celebration.

"There was a lot of pressure," Briscoe conceded. "It was kind of weird. I wasn't driving hard so it's not like I was on the ragged edge, but it was just so hard having a guy chasing you, especially the guy that's the greatest of all time here, to be trying to save fuel and everything else.

Hamlin, a three-time winner this year who is returning to competition after missing

PROCK, LANGDON, HERRERA FIND WINS IN VIRGINIA

DINWIDDIE, Va. (June 22, 2025) - Funny Car points leader and reigning world champion Austin Prock won for the second straight year at Virginia Motorsports Park on Sunday, defeating John Force Racing teammate Jack Beckman in the final round of the fifth annual American Rebel Light Virginia Nationals.

Shawn Langdon (Top Fuel) and Gaige Herrera (Pro Stock Motorcycle) also won the ninth of 20 races during the 2025 NHRA Mission Foods Drag Racing Series season.

In the final round, Prock went 4.061-seconds at 318.02 mph in his 12,000-horsepower Cornwell Tools Chevrolet SS Funny Car, holding off Beckman at the finish line and picking up his third win of the season.

It was also an emotional win for Prock, as the matchup between JFR teammates took place a year after legendary Funny Car driver John Force was involved in a massive crash at Virginia Motorsports Park. "A lot of emotion for sure," Prock said. "Getting to win last year, that was huge and being able to take the Wally to John as a team, that's what we wanted to do again today, and I'm happy that we could go backlast week's Mexico City race to be home in North Carolina for the birth of his son, showed why he is a seven-time Pocono winner, the track's all-time best.

His runner-up finish marks the 10th time he's finished first or second at the unique 2.5-mile three-turn Pocono oval. He won in 2023 and now has finished second in the two races since.

Blaney, who earned his first career NA-SCAR Cup Series victory at Pocono in 2017 and answered with a win last year, finished third-place finish - especially impressive considering he started from the back of the grid after making adjustments on his car following qualifying.

Chris Buescher, who like Blaney earned his first career NASCAR Cup Series win at Pocono (2016), started his No. 17 Ford on the outside of the front row and was among the day's nine leaders - ultimately finishing fourth. Hendrick Motorsports' Chase Elliott was fifth with back-to-back top-five finishes for the first time this year.

Briscoe's victory - the third of his career - makes him the 11th driver to earn a position in the 16-driver Playoff field - the sixth different in just the last eight weeks.

With nine races remaining to set the Playoff field, Hendrick's Alex Bowman sits in that 16th-place position, 20-points up on Preece for that final points-only transfer position.

"Each has made a lasting impact on our sport and lifestyle — whether through competition, advocacy, innovation, or inspiration. PALOU REACHES 'SWEET SIX' AFTER ROAD AMERICA VICTORY | From INDYCAR media

ELKHART LAKE, Wis. (June 22, 2025) – After 55 laps of ferocious, frantic uncertainty, about the only certain thing in the NTT INDYCAR SERIES happened again at Road America — Alex Palou and his Chip Ganassi Racing crew standing in victory lane.

Palou stretched the available fuel in his No. 10 SOLO Cup Chip Ganassi Racing Honda at the end to earn his sixth victory in nine starts this season in the XPEL Grand Prix at Road America Presented by AMR, becoming the first INDYCAR SERIES driver to take the checkered flag at least six times in a season since Will Power in 2011.

"It was a crazy race," Palou said. "There were moments I thought we were losing a ton of positions. It was a tough race for everybody. Kudos to the team for the amazing strategy and Honda for giving us the fuel mileage we needed at the end to make it."

Three-time series champion Palou expanded his lead to 93 points over Andretti Global's Kyle Kirkwood with the victory in a race of varying fuel and tire strategies as the season passed its halfway point, with eight races remaining on the 17-race schedule.

Felix Rosenqvist was unshackled from a fuel-saving strategy over the closing laps in the No. 60 SiriusXM Honda of Meyer Shank Racing w/Curb-Agajanian but fell 2.1725 seconds short to finish second. Santino Ferrucci had just enough Shell 100% Renewable Race Fuel to hang on to third in the No. 14 Sexton Properties/AJ Foyt Racing Chevrolet, his fourth straight top-five finish this season. There were a race-record nine leaders today, with Palou taking the top spot for good on Lap 53 of the 55-lap race when teammate and leader Scott Dixon couldn't pull off another miraculous fuel save and was forced to pit in the No. 9 PNC Bank Chip Ganassi Racing Honda. The next race is The Honda Indy 200 at Mid-Ohio Presented by the all-new 2026 Passport on Sunday, July 6 at Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course in Lexington, Ohio.
