Fishing Magician

Cold and wet weather has kept many anglers off the water in the region lately. There are still many very good fishing opportunities, though, and when there are breaks in the weather, people are out taking advantage of them.

The torrential rains we have been getting here in Leavenworth finally stopped so I ran over to check on the Icicle River. There were a few more vehicles in the parking area near the handicapped platform. Just as I arrived a young boy started yelling that he had a fish on. I watched him struggle with a big coho and his father ran down to the bank with a net. He managed to scoop it

up and he and his son celebrated. The boy immediately called his mother and bragged that he just landed his second salmon! He was casting a pink jig from the platform, and it sure worked. I talked to another angler that was casting from the platform, and he had landed a fish earlier that morning and had several "chasers" that he could see go after his spinner. Although the water is very high it has cleared from the previous days when it rose quickly with the heavy rain. Obviously, there are more fish moving into the Icicle and fishing should continue to be good for a while.

A number of years ago when I got back from a steelhead fishing trip on the Deschutes River in Oregon, I left my fly rod at the takeout. The rod was made for me by my good friend Bill McGuire and had been with me on trips to Belize where I caught my first bonefish with it and I caught many steelhead on the Methow River with it. I was just sick and didn't even tell my wife about it for six months. She was a good friend of Bill's, too. Many months later I got an e-mail from Kevin Brown, asking if I knew a guy named Bill McGuire, and during a phone call told me he had

stop planned, and that was to meet Kevin. I was so thankful, and I invited Kevin and his father to join me that summer for a trip to Banks Lake and Rufus Woods. We had a great time. This experience proved to me that there are still some very special people out there. Kevin is one of them.

Sure, it's cold outside, but that doesn't mean that there aren't good fishing opportunities. I looked back at some of the photos that I took in November, and I found some great shots of fish caught on cold late fall days. One was taken on Lake Chelan and showed a couple of very big kokan-

ee. I remember this one in particular as the two anglers that came with me that day really weren't dressed for the weather. They toughed it out, and although we didn't get many fish, they didn't complain and were willing to go with me again. I am sure they will be bundled up next time. The photo was taken below Rocky Point, which is off the north shore of Lake Chelan, and is one of my best places to look for kokanee any time of year. I used to always launch at the State Park and run up above the Yacht Club in the fall and winter, but in recent years I have found good numbers of kokanee in the lower basin. I don't expect to catch kokanee as large as the ones in the photo this fall, but I do think there are good numbers of them in the lake.

One of the places that you will find me on a late fall or early winter day is at Medicare Beach on Potholes Reser-

voir. There is a long stretch of beach here on the east side of the reservoir that is a popular spot for shore angling. Big rainbow will cruise off this shore within casting distance, and patient anglers often get trout weighing 2 to 3 pounds and sometimes even larger. There's the Perch Point Wild Camping Area located at the south end of the access. There are some picnic tables scattered along the park area and a couple of vault toilets. People will pick a spot on the beach, set up a couple of rod holders and cast bait as far as they can out into the water. Most people use a marshmallow and worm, marshmallow and shrimp combo or Power Bait.

> Many will bring a folding chair to sit in while they wait for a bite. To reach Medicare Beach, take a right off of Highway 17 between Moses Lake and Othello at Road 6 SE or Road M SE and then take a right at Road J SE. The last turn will lead you down to the beach. This week's photo was taken at Medicare Beach.

I made another trip to the net pens on Rufus Woods Reservoir recently. I have had great success fishing here this fall and wanted to get some more of the triploid rainbow trout for my smoker. My family loves getting pieces of smoked trout over the Holidays, and I want-

ed to be sure I had a good supply. Rollie Schmitten and I launched the Bob Feil Boats and Motors Smoker Craft Phantom at the middle net pens, and I fired up the Mercury 250 for the short run to the upper pens. I deployed the Minn Kota at the place where I always find fish and checked the screen on the Garmin. The image wasn't encouraging, but we tried jigging on one rod and Power Bait on the other rods. Nothing was happening, and I was blaming that on the fact that there was no current. They started the feeding machine and I thought that would spark a bite, but even that didn't happen. When we got back to the dock we talked to other boats, and they had only three fish between seven anglers. The people that did the best were fishing from the shore right next to the launch!





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TOOLS

This is a good time to clean your hand tools. Remove all dirt and rust from the metal, sand and repaint wooden handles. Store in a dry location for the winter.

BULBS



As long as the ground has not frozen, you can plant spring bulbs directly into the garden. Follow instructions on bulb packaging for depth of planting & provide a mulch cover over the top of newly planted bulbs to prevent heaving.

TREES & SHRUBS



Continue to water your trees and shrubs until the ground freezes. Tie up or trim back branches of loosely branched Evergreens. Pull mulch away from trunks to prevent rodents from hiding and eating the bark.

HOUSEPLANTS



Check plants that have summered outside for pests frequently. Reduce your rate of watering to allow for slower growth and do not fertilize until spring. Plant forced bulbs (paperwhites, amaryllis) now for winter interest.

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

WHAT IS IT WORTH?



Realtors® frequently get asked about the value of property by owners who are just curious about how their property compares in the current market, or they really need to know because they will be selling soon or need the value for estate planning purposes. Realtors® are usually happy to oblige because it offers them the opportunity to give something of value in exchange for the chance to get the selling job later. I always caution owners that a market analysis is not a certified appraisal, even though the process and results are similar. It really should be called a Brokers Price Opinion.

Assigning value to a property is a subjective thing since it is only an opinion of value, not fact. The value is really defined as "what one buyer is willing to pay, within a time frame that is acceptable to the seller."

In this revelatory process, most owners find that they can stomach the tax assessor's valuation once they understand that the real market value is actually higher. 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



UNLIMITED HYDRO'S WINNINGEST DRIVER, DAVE VILLWOCK, ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT

Kennewick, Wash. (Nov. 10, 2025) — After more than three decades of rewriting the record books and setting the gold standard in hydroplane racing, Dave Villwock, the most successful driver in H1 Unlimited history, has officially announced his retirement from competition.

With an unprecedented 68 career victories, 11 Gold Cup titles, and 10 National High Point Championships, Villwock's name is synonymous with excellence. His technical precision, fierce competitiveness, and leadership on and off the water have made him one of the sport's most respected figures.

Villwock's final season came with BWR Racing, where he guided the team to its first-ever APBA Gold Cup victory in 2025, a fitting finale for one of racing's most accomplished drivers.

"I was privileged and excited to help get the new team BWR started last year and was blessed with another Gold Cup win, which would be the first for this fantastic new team," Villwock said.

Villwock, 71, went on to explain, "After over 30 years of driving these awesome boats it's time to step away and enjoy some other passions like family, home, and model airplanes."

"I wish Jimmy Shane and all the BWR team members the very best and will be there to help anytime Bruce or the BWR team needs it," Villwock said.

Villwock's journey began in the 1980s, working in race shops before moving into the driver's seat, a transition that would change the course of the sport.

Behind the wheel of legendary boats such as Miss Budweiser, Miss E-Lam Plus, and Spirit of Qatar, he became a dominant force known for his unmatched preparation, precision, and relentless drive to win.

He helped modernize hydroplane racing through innovation and professionalism, setting performance standards that still define success in the sport today.

Even after a career-threatening injury in 1997, Villwock's comeback became part of his legend, proof of the resilience and determination that made him one of motorsports' toughest competitors.

Villwock's impact on racing excellence continues to be celebrated. He will be formally inducted into the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America in March 2026, an honor recognizing his unmatched achievements and lifelong contribution to the sport of hydroplane racing.

Bruce Ratchford, owner of BWR Racing and president of Apollo Mechanical, expressed his appreciation for Villwock's role in the team's first year:

"Dave's experience, focus, and attention to detail were instrumental in helping BWR Racing take shape and succeed right out of the gate," Ratchford said. "His knowledge of the boats, his calm confidence under pressure, and his commitment to excellence set the tone for our entire program."

"Dave Villwock's record speaks for itself," said H1 Unlimited Chairman Mike Denslow. "He changed how people race these boats and how teams operate. His name will forever be a benchmark in our sport."

While Villwock leaves the cockpit, he remains involved in the sport he helped build.

"He remains a trusted voice within BWR Racing and continues to inspire both current and future generations of hydroplane competitors," Denslow added.

KENNEWICK, WA (Nov. 4, 2025) -BWR Racing owner Bruce Ratchford is pleased to announce the signing of veteran unlimited hydroplane driver Jimmy Shane to the team's racing stable for the 2026 season.

Shane replaces the retiring Dave Vilwock.

Shane, who had amassed 25 victories - including five Gold Cups - and seven national championships, retired from the sport at the end of the 2022 season to focus on his family.

"I'm very excited for the opportunity, and I felt like it was a good time for me," Shane said. "I had accomplished most of the goals I wanted to on my little break. I feel like I can have a good balance returning to racing and supporting those goals going forward."

Suitably, those goals, as he put it, are another generation in his footsteps. Shane, whose 9- and 12-year old sons are also racing, said that the family environment at BWR and in the hydroplane racing fraternity as a whole made the decision easier.

"My oldest son has been racing for three years now, and this was my youngest son's rookie season in Junior Hydro and Junior Runabout," Shane said. "He won the 2025 championship in J-hydro in only his third race. I'm really thrilled about that."

"I can tell that Bruce truly has in his heart

what is best for the sport and for the team," he continued. "That was one of the things that really got me over the hump to come

Ratchford, who is on the heels of a national championship-winning and Gold Cup-winning debut season in H1 Unlimited, is excited to add Shane to the team, as he feels that their philosophies will align perfectly going into the teams' sophomore

"I'm thrilled," he said. "This guy, he's got a big picture mind and he knows how it all works. I just love his thought process."

Shane spent the majority of his career and enjoyed his greatest success - in the cockpit of the Miss Madison racing team. which campaigned under sponsorship from Oberto Meats and HomeStreet Bank during his tenure.

During that time, he worked hand in hand with U-91 Goodman Real Estate crew chief Mike Hanson, and drove both of BWR's primary racing hulls to race victories and national championships.

"I think it's wonderful," Hanson said. "He was a great driver for the Miss Madison team. We won a lot of races with him and a lot of national championships. He's got a good square head on his shoulders, and he will be a good asset for BWR and for the sport."

Ratchford is similarly enthusiastic about the partnership.

"He's got it all. And it's really important to have that kind of relationship," Ratchford said of Shane's connection with the BWR crews. "We're thrilled to have him back in the boat. It's definitely a statement not just about winning races but about the entire sport."

Shane is also excited by the potential reunion, as the BWR teams include many former team members that he worked side by side with previously.

"I'm pretty stoked to get back with many of the same faces that I knew before," he said. "There's instant comfort and trust. I can drive like I did in the past, knowing that they understand me and I understand them. I'm very fortunate for the opportunity to come back and show I still have what
